

- Dog bins







#### Proposed 20 mph Zone Pannal Ash area

#### APPLICATION TO NYCC NOVEMBER 2022

Application for 20 mph Zone in the Pannal Ash area along with infrastructure submitted to North Yorkshire County Council November 2022 under the NYCC Revised 20 mph Speed Limit Policy (Jan 2022)

Application included supportive letters from Headteachers, Councillors and the Red Kite Alliance

Reply from NYCC in January 2023 – no timeline for considering application.


#### Summer 2023

Further meeting between those in attendance at previous meetings to have an update Summer 2023

#### **Otley Road Corridor Sustainability Package**

- Funding of £4.275 million from the *National Productivity Investment Fund*
- Only £565,000 remaining from the fund.
- NYC is to develop a sustainable package of measures along the Otley Road Corridor, using the £565K.
- HAPARA to meet with NYC officers in early May
- Workshop planned for mid-late May
- The intention is for this package to be put before the Area Constituency Committee by July of this year.

- Facilities at bus stops






#### **A Town Council for Harrogate**

New Council comes into effect from 1 April 2024





#### A Town Council for Harrogate

- 19 Councillors 2 for Harlow & St Georges
- Local community voice to represent Interests of town.
- independent of North Yorkshire Council (but statutory consultee)
- Precept between £40 and £60 p.a. (raising £1million to £1.6 million)



North Yorkshire County Council is carrying out a review, known as a Community Governance Review, to An opportunity to have your say decide whether a new town or parish council should be created for the parts of Harrogate town which do not

currently have a town or parish council.


All local residents, business representatives and other local organisations are invited to give their views on the Council's recommendations by completing the survey by 5 May 2023.

Harrogate and Scarborough are currently the only parts of North Yorkshire that do not have a town or parish council to represent their residents. On 1 April 2023 a new unitary authority, to be known as North Yorkshire Council, will replace North Yorkshire County Council, Harrogate Borough Council, Scarborough Borough Background Council and the other five district councils. The new council will deliver all services and is committed to keeping services local and empowering communities. A town council for Harrogate would provide a tier of governance which could give residents more control and ownership of local services and enable Harrogate to have consistency with all other areas of the county in discussions with the new unitary council.


North Yorkshire County Council agreed to commence the review on 19 July 2022 and the first round of public consultation took place from 22 August to 14 October 2022, The consultation responses were analysed and used to develop draft recommendations, which were considered by the North Yorkshire County
